LOCAL CO-OP DIRECTOR EARNS NATIONAL CREDENTIAL

MELROSE, Minn. – Jerome "Jerry" Fries, Stearns Electric Association Board of Director, received the Director Gold Credential certificate from the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) in April.

Director Gold Credential recognizes directors who have already earned their Credentialed Cooperative Director (CCD) and Board Leadership Certificate (BLC), and who wish to continue learning throughout their service on the board. Fries is the first director in Stearns Electric history to earn the Director Gold Credential certificate.

An ever-changing business environment has imposed new demands on electric cooperative directors, requiring increased knowledge of changes in the electric utility industry, new governance skills, and a solid knowledge of the cooperative principles and business model. Stearns Electric has committed to work through NRECA to sharpen this body of knowledge for the benefit of its electric cooperative member-consumers.

"The education that our directors obtain through NRECA's training and education program provides a solid foundation of knowledge of the energy industry for our directors, and allows them to better serve our members and lead the Cooperative," Robin Doege, Stearns Electric CEO, said. "The Director Gold certificate demonstrates to our member-consumers Jerry's ongoing commitment to advancing his knowledge of the energy industry."

For a director to earn the Director Gold certificate, they must have already earned the CCD and BLC, and earn three additional credits from the BLC series of courses. Unlike the CCD and BLC certificates, Director Gold includes a continuing education requirement which calls for directors to earn three credits of approved course work and/or conferences every two years to maintain their Director Gold status.

Fries was first elected to the Cooperative's Board in 2015 to represent District 9, which serves Minnesota Townships St. Joseph, Wakefield, Rockville and Maine Prairie in Stearns County. He was re-elected in 2018.

NRECA represents the nation's more than 900 private, consumer-owned electric cooperatives, which provide electric service to more than 42 million people in 47 states, including Melrose-based Stearns Electric Association.

OPERATION ROUND UP® CONTRIBUTES \$60,750 TO 20 AREA FOOD SHELVES, 51 LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS

Melrose, Minn. - Stearns Electric's Operation Round Up® Program contributed \$60,750 to 71 area organizations in March, including \$2,000 each to 20 area food shelves. Through the Operation Round Up® program, Stearns Electric Association gives its member-consumers the opportunity to give back to the community by rounding up their electric bill to the nearest dollar.

Since the program's inception in 1993, Operation Round Up (ORU) and Stearns Electric members have awarded over \$2.6 million to 4,961 local non-profit organizations and community service programs. The rounded-up funds, no more than \$11.88 per year, per member, are placed in a trust fund that is administered by the Stearns Electric Association Trust Board.

Trust Board Directors met on March 10 to review applications and funding requests. Seventy-one organizations were selected to receive funds totaling between \$250 to \$2,000 in this round of contributions.



Congratulations to SPOT's Newest Certified Lymphadema Therapist



March is National Lymphedema Month. Kirsten Becker, PT recently completed the Manual Lymph Drainage (Vodder Technique) and Complete Decongestive Therapy Training program with Klose Training. This included Manual Lymph Drainage and Lymphedema bandaging.

What is the difference between **EDEMA** and LYMPHEDE-MA? Edema is a symptom of the body's normal response to an injury such as a sprain, etc. As healing progresses, excess fluid leaves the swelling area and the Lymphedema is a disease condition that occurs when the lymphatic system is impaired to the extent that the amount of lymphatic fluid in an area exceeds the capacity of the lymphatic transport system to remove it. The body itself cannot just reverse the swelling with elevation, because the lymphatic system is unable to transport it away. We can assist the body with manual drainage techniques to move the fluid away from a malfunctioning lymph system to an area of intact lymph nodes, or pathways to remove the fluid. We also can use short stretch bandages (Cotton flat knit – not ACE bandages) and bandaging to move the fluid from distally to proximally with the help of exercises/activity to move the fluid out of the body. Then we can use day or night time sleeves/ compression garments to maintain progress after therapy has achieved

improved function/reduced volume.

Typical treatment is daily wraps times 2 weeks in PT/OT, then reduced frequency and home wrapping/garments to maintain with home programs.


