## Glaucoma

Glaucoma is a group of eye conditions that damage the optic nerve, the health of which is vital for good vision. The damage is often caused by an abnormally high pressure in your eye. Glaucoma is one of the second leading causes of blindness for people over 60.

Currently, regular eye exams are the best prevention against significant damage from glaucoma. Those who are at higher risk include people with diabetes, people with a family history of glaucoma and people of African descent. Vision loss is silent, slow, and progressive but damage can be prevented if the disease is recognized in the early stages.
