24 NORTH LOFTS ON COLLEGE AVENUE!

After almost four years of saying "Coming Soon!," 'soon' finally arrived for developers Jon Petters and Dr. Gustavo Pena with the March 7th ground breaking of 24 North Lofts.

Financed by Kensington bank of St. Cloud, Winkelman Construction will begin construction of 17-unit residential and retail building located on College Avenue North, adjacent to the business partners' existing Mill Stream Shops and Lofts.

Petters said he is pleased about the architectural details of these lofts, designed by architect Patrick Waddick, which include authentic exterior gas lanterns. Each unit has an expansive west or south-



facing covered balcony or ground floor patio, a fireplace, and is accessible by elevator. "We're excited that we already have reservation deposits for four of the I7 lofts. Living here in downtown St. Joseph is attractive for people of all ages and we know we're creating a place that people will want to come home to." In addition to garages and off-street parking, they're including the unique feature of a private dog-walking area for the building's residents.

A 3,900 square foot ground floor retail or restaurant space is available for lease, with an additional 800 square feet available in a historic building being restored, adjacent to the main site. "The City of St. Joseph, particularly the city leadership, were so helpful in making this building finally a reality after four years of 'coming soon' said Petters. A completion date of late fall, 2018 is planned.

What is Bluetooth?



Bluetooth is a wireless (wire-replacement) communications technology standard for exchanging small amounts of data over short distances (using short-wavelength radio waves instead of wires or cables). Because Bluetooth devices use a radio (broadcast) communications system, the two paired devices do not have to be in visual line of sight of each other.

Bluetooth is a simple way for cellphones, printers, PCs, digital cameras, and other gadgets to link together.

Bluetooth and Wi-Fi are often confused because both are used to transfer data wirelessly, but they're actually very different. A common question most people have about Bluetooth technology is whether you need Wi-Fi connection to pair Bluetooth devices. You don't.

The name "Bluetooth" is an Anglo version of the Scandinavian *Blåtand/Blåtann*, a descriptive term used to describe the tenth-century king Harald Bluetooth who united Danish tribes into a single kingdom. The technology Bluetooth does the same with communications, uniting them into one universal standard.

The word piconet may appear with the same information as Bluetooth information. A piconet is created when numerous Bluetooth devices are sharing information together, forming a mini computer network called a piconet. Other devices can join or leave an existing piconet at any time. A cellphone, known as the master device, normally acts as the overall controller of the piconet, while the others (known as slaves) obey the master's instructions.

Wi-Fi (Wireless Fidelity) is designed to transport large amounts of data between computers and the Internet, often over great distances. Coverage can range from a few feet to an entire airport. It can involve elaborate security and it generally uses higher power levels, so arguably presents a slightly greater health risk if used for long periods. Wi-Fi also connects multiple computers and devices over a wireless network. By far the most typical Wi-Fi scenario for consumers consists of a central base station (wireless router) installed by an Internet provider in a home or business. It sends out what might be thought of as invisible Internet "rays" around the house that can be tapped into by any laptops, smartphones or tablets within their range to get online.

Interviewing Candidates For A Good Job Fit

Job Interviews can be the pivotal point in moving your organization rapidly forward. Or; sinking into the abyss. Your staff will ultimately determine if your product has any value at all. Your 'widget' or service-idea may sound great; but it's your staff that will ultimately prevail. A sound candidate interview can make all the difference. Consider the following:

Accurate job descriptions.

Know exactly what the position entails and what is expected of the employee. Consider previous employees in the same capacity and what made them successful. Your due diligence should guard against simply filling an open position.

Pre-screen phone interviews.

You don't need to interview every candidate in person. Phone interviews can trim the talent pool with a few basic questions in 15-30 minutes. If they don't impress you over the phone, skip the face-to-face interview.

Carefully crafted questions.

Candidates with interview experience tend to be well-versed in such routine questions like "What are your strengths and weaknesses?". Responses to such questions seldom serve any value. Question their experiences and relationships with supervisors or co-workers.



They reveal more of their personal work culture when prompted to freely discuss relationships with others. Remember; they also prepare for the interview.

Promote a focused dialogue.

Plan for a distraction-free interview. A nondescript conference room will tend to keep the communication in focus. Distractions and interruptions break up fruitful discussions, as well as making you look disorganized.

Plan to get what you need.

Craft your questions carefully. Job-fit questions generated from scientifically reliable and validated personality assessments can be a great source for eliciting direct responses. The candidate should respond with an answer that either strengthens their candidacy or weakens it. Guard against the compulsion to clarify your questions if they struggle to respond. They should either have an answer or not. If they don't; acknowledge and accept their 'non-answer'.

The employees you hire tend to be only as good as your interview process. Put a plan in place and follow it. Fit the position-don't settle for filling the position!
