







Keep these suggestions in mind:

- During the hottest hours of the day, stay inside. If possible stay inside an air-conditioned building. The hottest hours of the day are typically from mid morning to mid afternoon.
- Dress lightly, and when sleeping, use lightweight, breathable covers.



• Avoid drinking alcohol and beverages that are carbonated or contain caffeine when temperatures are high, as they can lead to dehydration.

- Keep blinds and curtains closed from morning until the late afternoon to block extra direct heat from sunlight.
- Move your exercise routine to early morning or later in the evening.
- Never ever leave a person or a pet in the car in hot conditions while you run to do a quick errand.
- Properly supervise children during outdoor play, being sure to monitor them closely and frequently.
- Seek medical care right away if you become nauseous, start vomiting or experience cramps.
- Stay on the lowest level of your home.
- Use a fan. Don't place the fan directly in front of a window because it may push hot air in. Try placing the fan so that it blows in the room and out the window instead.
- Use small appliances like slow cookers and tabletop grills rather than your traditional oven or stove to keep kitchen heat to a minimum.
- Verify that seat belts and car seat restraints are not too hot before buckling yourself or anyone else into a car.

Additional Tips for Elderly Persons

Elderly individuals are particularly at risk for heat exposure. A few special considerations for keeping elderly persons safe during the summer include the following:

- ♦ Visit elderly family members or friends twice a day during the hottest months of the summer.
- ♦ If there is a heat hotline in your area, make sure that your elderly loved ones have the number and know when to call.
- ♦ Help your elderly pal to get to know his or her neighbors because isolated older adults are at a much higher risk of heat-related health problems and death.
- Provide on-going education to elderly individuals. Go over topics such as heat exposure-related symptoms and where to call for help.
- ♦ Investigate public community center solutions that have air conditioning and provide transportation for elderly individuals.
- ♦ Work with utility company to ensure that electricity is not shut off during the hottest summer days.

Cover Your Cam! Webcam Covers Secure Privacy

You may not be surprised that the first webcam ever created was at Cambridge University. But do you know why? It was developed in 1991 and pointed at the coffee pot in the Computer Science Department at Cambridge. This webcam was used to determine if fresh coffee was available, so individuals wouldn't waste time getting up and going to the coffee pot, only to find it empty.

Today, webcams are far more useful, they capture video and stream the images, in real time, through the computer. You can enjoy video conferencing, chatting with friends, monitoring security and connecting with family. The problem arises because that video can be captured, saved, viewed and forwarded via the internet or emailed as an attachment to places unknown.

By infecting the victim's computer with a virus, a hacker can remotely activate a webcam and watch anything within the webcam's field of vision, sometimes the webcam owner. The fraudulent process of attempting to hack into a person's webcam and activate it without the webcam owner's permission has been called camfecting. With camfecting malware such as Blackshades and Delilah lurking on the Internet, it should be clear there are significant risks associated with having an unsecured Internet-connected camera. Don't depend upon the "in use" light. Gone are the days when a green light turned on to indicate the web camera was in use.

The best line of defense to protect privacy is the extremely easy action of covering the webcam. Truth be told, tape and sticker work but don't look very professional. Try a webcam cover.

Your Best Employee Doesn't Always Make the Best Manager

You have a wonderful employee that shows great promise. Her work is excellent. And you need a new manager. The choice is obvious and your 'golden child' is given the job managing your staff. Everyone's excited!

Then the wheels fall off. Your manager has people calling in sick who hadn't been sick in years. There's bickering amongst the staff. Performance falters and even a few employees begin job-hunting. This may describe a worst-case scenario; but any of it is no good!

Management requires certain qualities and not every high performer has them. <u>Hugh Latif</u>, author of <u>Maverick Leadership</u> identifies five essential attributes to measure for management potential.

They must be a good team player. If they aren't; it's game over. The manager is playing for the team; all of them. That includes superiors, subordinates and colleagues.



Character should be the first thing to evaluate; their honesty and their integrity. The organization and her staff must both trust her.

Technical knowledge and present performance are "qualifications" that tend to demonstrate capabilities. These criteria are relevant as experiences that the manager can draw from to coach her staff.

People skills are important. Can they communicate, direct, motivate, encourage, support, teach, develop, train and coach others?

Does the candidate fit the culture? Is there chemistry with leadership, the rest of the team, and the company culture and values?

Follow this formula for selecting managers and chances are good you have made a sound choice.

Envision St. Joseph-Comprehensive Plan

The City of St. Joseph is updating the City's Comprehensive Plan. A Comprehensive Plan is a guide on how the community wants to develop into the future. Plan components include land use, housing, economic development, transportation, community facilities, parks and recreation, and sustainability. The Comprehensive Plan update guided by an Advisory Committee and the Planning Commission began in 2017 and is anticipated to be completed in the spring of 2018. The Draft Comprehensive Plan has been prepared to serve as a blueprint in the future development and growth of St. Joseph and public input has provided the foundation in creating the draft plan. The Planning Commission will hold a public hearing on the Draft Comprehensive Plan on June 11, 2018 beginning at 6 p.m. or shortly thereafter.
